#### WRITER/DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Small Gods was a gift to write. The first 50 pages of the book spilled out of me, in it's chaotic anxiety, at a time when I was feeling overwhelmed by writing and theatre as a whole. A mentor told me, just write the play you want to see. And a coming of age queer comedy is what came out. This story was bombastic, there were too many words and none of them mattered and all of them were the most important thing in the world. Each character led the charge and wanted the story to be about them. I fell in love with each of them the more I wrote. But

it was in the early workshops of the play that Landon Doak approached me to turn it into a musical. The destiny of this story was always a musical one. Now, I can't unhear the songs that also spill out of the characters. In all it's anxiety, fun, humour, seriousness, and stakes, I find myself basking in the joy of witnessing queer teenagers wrestle with heartbreak, crushes, life decisions, and all the things we need to deal with - and they problem-solve together, not IN SPITE of their queerness, but BECAUSE of it! They understand kinship, community, and deep, lasting friendship. Sheridan College afforded me the chance to direct the staging of this play - and I happened to get some of the most incredible, beautifully hearted, open, and energized group of young artists I've had the privilege of working with. This musical belongs to them as much as it does to Landon and myself. Thank you to Sheridan, to Landon, to Avery-Jean (our incredible MD), and to Kasie (our amazing SM) for making this such a beautiful journey. Here's to queer joy in all it's form!

#### **COMPOSER'S NOTE**

It's been such a genuine privilege to put Makram's tale to music. Back in 2021, I was asked to be a part of a workshop for the play, Small Gods (at the Start of the World), here at factory, as an actor. I quickly fell in love with the story, the characters, and Makram. Makram writes such soulful characters and leads a room with so much grace and fun! I felt in my bones it would make a great musical, I just had to sell Makram on the idea. It was an easy sell tbh. I think, as a teenager, life feels like a musical. the highs are high, the lows are low, and the stakes of figuring out one's identity and how it fits into the world are high. The musical world of this show is meant to reflect that experience, from pop punk angst, to bubble gum pop fantasy, to musical theatre heartbreak ballad. These characters are so full, and it feels like they each wrote their own songs. I love being a part of this queer joy, and letting these characters sing what is in their hearts. We wanted to write a show that we would have loved and seen ourselves in during that time of our lives. I hope we did that. Thanks Makram!

#### WRITER'S NOTE

The idea for 18 Palace Road was born in June 2019, contemplating all the depth and meaning in a relationship between a music teacher and student. Writing did not begin until a year later, after the beginning of a pandemic provided plentiful space and time to process and write. The first version of the show premiered in October 2021 at Grace-Church-On-The-Hill, serving as a vice to process not only the loss of my wonderful childhood piano teacher in 2016, but also all the other grief, nostalgia, and melancholy feelings that we so often let build up inside ourselves. Three years later, the 18 Palace Road onstage today is entirely different. Carly, a first year university student, struggles with fitting into school, keeping up with peers, and completing the composition she must write to stay in her program. The audience witnesses her struggle to balance her commitments and open up to her peers, all while flashbacks from her childhood show her developing a close relationship with her piano teacher Marge. It is revealed that Marge died right after Carly's audition to music school, and Carly is struggling to accept this. With the help of committed family, friends, and her inherent love for music, Carly processes her teacher's death and finally writes a piece that she - and Marge - would be proud of. While this segment does not dive into Carly's experience with grief (as this occurs later in the show) it does showcase the immense difficulties of growing up - trying to figure out exactly who you are when that person keeps changing, or trying to be perfect when sometimes it is hard enough to be anything at all. Perhaps this show has a space performed by young people dealing with the same challenges as Carly, or perhaps it is meant for older, more experienced actors. However, I hope that anyone engaging with 18 Palace Road will feel slightly more healed, slightly more grounded, and slightly more sure that they will make it through difficult times - just as I have felt working on it for the past few years.




