Director's Notes

When we were approached to create a revue based on the music of Jerome Kern, both Chris and I were equally "excited and scared." What could you do with such eloquent music and so many ballads? We decided to try something new, to marry several worlds, to attempt to look at the man behind the music. We took the title 'All the things you are' seriously and decided to look at the man who wrote all this incredible music, beginning at the start of the last century. It was important for us to point out the fact that much of this music is now almost one hundred years old, yet still so timely and relevant today.

Jerome Kern was one of those epic figures which we hear so much about in terms of music but very little about in terms of his personal life and who the man was behind all this fantastic music. 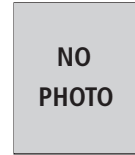
